



Pit Tables @ Field

The restraining dowels on our tables that prevent our airplanes from moving forward after we start their engines have been getting loose. On June 24, 2011, I installed slightly larger oak dowels with new foam sleeves. Thus, our tables are safer. I reduced the diameter of each dowel only on one end. Thus, if they fit too tightly, please remove the dowel, slide the foam sleeve to the other end, and replace the thinner end in the hole. Most of the retaining holes are $\frac{3}{4}$ " diameter. Some are slightly larger while some are slightly smaller. Either way, one end or the other should fit.

Many men clean off the aluminum tops after using them. Thanks so much for your courtesy to us who come after you and use them for our planes. It's so nice to set a plane down on a clean table top, isn't it? Most men are thoughtful and clean up after themselves. Thanks for your thoughtfulness.

Thanks to all who worked on our annual July 4^{th} Club Picnic. It takes quite a coordinated effort to successfully put this together. A special thanks to Frank Battaglia who provided banana splits for us. Folks are asking him what he plans to bring for us next year!

Maynard Hill (1926-2011)

The Wall Street Journal for June 11-12 ran an article about Maynard, whom they called "The Lindberg of Hobbyists." Why call him this? In August 2002, Maynard flew a model airplane from Cape Spear, Newfoundland to Ireland, almost 1,900 miles away. The model had just a 6 foot wingspan and was the first r/c model to cross the Atlantic! It took him several years to develop the airplane from balsa and red monokote. He also developed a light four cycle engine and an autopilot guided by GPS. He used Coleman stove fuel and believe it or not, the plane needed less than a gallon for the entire trip according to the article.

In 1962, Maynard set the altitude record of 12,960 feet for an r/c plane. It was the first of 25 world records he set, each one marked by nailing a prop to his hobby shop door in Silver Springs, Md.

He was legally blind when he conceived the idea of the trans-Atlantic flight and his wife brought him to Newfoundland for the event.

Maynard was one of the greats in this hobby and his passing deserves recognition.

Marine Corps Museum @ Mira Mar

The museum is small and has about 5 or 6 propeller aircraft and about as many helicopters. It has a number of jets and a trailer that serves as a gift shop and place for airplane memorabilia. Our club donated \$2,000. to the museum about 8 years ago. They hope to someday build a huge hangar to accommodate all their aircraft which not are outdoors. This is a private venture which receives no funds from the Marines. A Corsair painted in midnight black as used in Korea is my favorite plane along with a Sikorsky S-55 and S-58. Projected cost of a new museum building is between \$43 and \$70 million!

We laid the tarps out along the outside edge of the structure, attached three ropes to awning (one on each end and one in the middle) and slid it over the steel support structure by pulling on the ropes that we slung over the top of the structure. Taking them down, folding them up, and putting them away was more difficult than installing them because of the wind.

The Treasurer gave his monthly report on the club finances. The current bank balance is at \$ 16, 638.46. Membership is now at 198.

The President commented on the recent 4th of July picnic. Turnout was a little lighter than expected but a good time was had by those that did attend. Frank Battaglia's banana splits were a huge success! We will most likely have a sign up sheet for next years picnic to get a more accurate number on those planning to attend.

A reminder that on Sunday, September 11th., we will be hosting the Boy Scouts to help them obtain their Aviation Merritt Badges. If you can help with this event please contact Todd Melton.

The Membership wanted to recognize Larry Hufford for his ongoing work in keeping the weeds mowed at the field. Larry spends many hours, during the growing season, keeping the fields surrounding our sight mowed. We appreciate, and thank him for his effort.

Frank Battaglia is asking that someone take over his job as Webmaster for our newsletter, The Transmitter. Increased hours at his job require that he step aside for now. If you can take over his duties, please contact a Board Member.

Frank Burke brought out the "Model of the Month" for this month. It was a F-14 TomCat by Great Planes. Powered by a 2 stroke engine, the jet weighs around 9 pounds. It has a 58ins. wingspan and is 51 inches long. Frank applied one of his famous beautiful monokote finishes. It looks extremely fast just sitting on the table. Congratulations Frank!

A discussion was held concerning our current dues structure. Several proposals were brought forward and debated. It is felt by many members that our \$200 per year rate should be modified or prorated for those who wish to join the club after the month of January each year. Some potential members are discouraged to join the Club and still pay the full amount for less than a years membership. A number of suggestions were brought forward, such as a \$20 dollar per month rate starting in June and after. There would be no paying on a "per month" plan. That is, all the remaining months of the year would need to be paid for and no refunds would be given. It was also suggested that those joining in the latter part of the year no longer receive October and November as "free months" towards the following years dues. Following a spirited discussion by the members a vote was called for. It was decided by vote that we will begin charging \$50 per quarter for Club membership. So, members joining in the first

quarter of the year would pay \$200 in dues. Those joining in the 2nd quarter would pay \$150. \$100 for the 3rd quarter and \$50 for the last quarter of the year. The new dues schedule would have members paying only for the months left in the year after they join. We hope this new method of paying dues will help to attract new members through out the entire year for the club.

Following the break, a slide and video presentation of the Heli Fun-Fly held in May was given by Scott Dedic. The videos and slides shown depicted the high level of participation at the event and also the fun enjoyed by all who were there for the three days. Scott's videos and photos made everyone feel as if they were there themselves. A great presentation Scott!

James D'Eliseo gave a very informative discussion on "reducing noise levels in flying models". His knowledge concerning the noise producing aspects of a model airplane and how to minimize each one was very interesting to hear. He shared the advantages of choosing the correct prop for each engine - plane combination and the noise levels of specific sizes of propellers. This coupled with a quality muffler system can greatly reduce the number of sound decibels a plane produces. He described his personal approach to keeping his planes as quiet as possible while still producing maximum power for 3D maneuvers. If you have ever seen and heard one of James' planes fly, you would agree he has mastered the art of low noise levels from a gas engine. Thanks James.

Towards the end of the meeting, Scott Dedic and Shawn, "EgyptShawn", Garcia showed some of their videos they have produced and are currently on U-Tube for viewing. These are well done and worth checking out.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:10 pm.



- Check receiver voltage under load.
- Check transmitter power level.
- Check engine high speed, nose up.
- Check engine idle, nose down.
- Extend transmitter antenna.
- Check control surface direction and response.
