




Our resident hawk likes to fly with us. Since he/she conducts regular fly-overs, I often take its picture. Guys call this the B-1RD thermal finder.










Lord Creedon looked great against the horizon on this typically fine San Diego Day.

Same plane but different angels make a big difference.




Chris Thompson's Hawker Hurricane is a fine flyer in colorful British markings.



Senator Tom Johnston's T-28 coming in on final looks superb, doesn't it?







A doctor-pilot and his son were flying it on Dec. 7, 1941 when a Japanese plane fired a round that went thru its fabic covered fuselage. It only made a small hole in the covering and the plane landed safely. It is now suspended in a hanger at Hickam Field on Oahu in their Air Museum. Model Of The Month Nov. 2016










Top photo is a Pacific Aeromodeler's DeHavilland Tiger Moth @ 22% scale.
